Councillor Muxworthy noted the opportunity to receive clarity on Watson Road and Tatlow Trail.

Mayor Drew provided background and history on the use of trails in Belcarra. He noted that an old fence that existed on the right of way for Watson Trail collapsed. When the fence was rebuilt, it was required to be relocated to the property line of the owner. Mayor Drew noted that trails were line items in both the 2017 Budget and 2018 Budget. Three Public Forums were held in 2016 to discuss the Tennis Court, Trails and related Public Safety and Public Access matters.

Considerable discussion ensued.

Councillor Ross noted that trails are very beneficial in the Village as there are no sidewalks and walking spaces along roadways are limited. He further noted that communication did take place regarding Trail development.
