





Belcarra Blockwatch

In the first week of January 2020 there were three residential break and enters in Anmore. All three homes were accessed by a thief or thieves through a basement door or window. Money, cheques and a computer were taken. Although Belcarra has an extremely low crime rate, it is not immune. In 2019 we also saw some B&Es. An attempted home invasion on Belcarra Bay Rd. was thwarted by locks and an alert resident as recently as November 10th.

To reduce the risk of burglary, review the following 10 home security tips recommended by the RCMP:

- 1. Lock all doors and windows, even when leaving briefly.
- 2. Keep windows covered and valuables out of sight.
- 3. Install motion sensor lights.
- 4. Trim shrubs and brush near home to eliminate hiding spots.
- 5. Install a security system and /or place an alarm sign in driveway/window. Purchase a camera and make it visible.
- 6. Lock up tools, ladders, bicycles etc.
- 7. When out or away leave a radio on.
- 8. Do not announce your vacation or trips on social media.
- 9. If you are away, have a neighbour park their car in your driveway periodically. Have someone pick up flyers, newspapers etc. Use light timers and have someone check your home if you are away for more than five days. (Most home insurance policies require this.)

Stories From The Archives — Arrival of the First Steel Rails at Port Moody

Researched By: Ralph Drew, Belcarra, BC, December 2019.

Source: Mainland Guardían, Thursday, March 8th, 1883

Port Moody — The first of a fleet of ships with the steel rails, arrived in English Bay on Thursday [March 1st, 1883] and is presumably at the wharf [in Port Moody] by this time [March 8th, 1883].

The steamship 'Victoria' leaves San Francisco for Port Moody, with locomotives, on 6th inst. [instant = same month = March 1883].


Quite a number of land speculators are now at the [railway] terminus [in Port Moody], "spying out the land", and the early approach of the [land] boom is looked for.

A large number of buildings are under contract and construction will commence as soon as the [sidewheeler] 'S.S. Maude' gets around with [building] materials.

Grading [of the railway bed] is progressing very favourably but, of course, will advance more rapidly when the rails are laid on the portion completed.

The choppers [right-of-way clearing crew] have crossed the Coquitlam [River].








Belcarra's Logo – 1882 Cameo Appearance





The Chinese zodiac gives each year an animal sign.


In popular Chinese astrology Chinese New Year is important. For Chinese people, years begin at Chinese New Year, rather than January 1!

On Sunday January 12, 2020, we received a phone call from Mr. Chris Doyle, Deputy Chief, Ministry of the Environment, South Coast Region, in regards to the "Anmore

Bear Incident" that occurred January 8 - 9, 2020. During this phone call Mr. Doyle stated that neither of us committed an offence and informed Michael that he would no longer be facing any enforcement action. Mr. Doyle stated that this incident with the bear cub had "taken on a life of its own" and he seemed shocked at how much anger was being directed at the B.C. Conservation Officer Service by the general public. (In our minds this anger and negative press is completely warranted and we feel that the BCCOS is antiquated and needs a complete overhaul by the provincial government). Mr. Doyle admitted that the incident was not handled properly by the BCCOS and will be discussed internally with staff in an effort to recognize the mistakes that were made and what changes and recommendations can be made going forward.

To clarify: acting in good faith and assisting a qualified professional in transporting to a permitted facility is NOT an offence under the Wildlife Act. The temperatures were sub zero, the weather changing, the bear was emaciated and was observed over 16 hours. The BCCOS failed to attend and assist the bear and the public. A qualified professional volunteer brought the bear to a permitted facility. Assisting in such a situation is not an offence.

We received an enormous amount of support from many individuals, nonprofits, and the media over the past few days and we would like to thank everyone for their support and kind words. Thanks to Nathan Wagstaffe at Critter Care Wildlife Society in Langley, Trish Boyum at Stop The Grizzly Killing, Michael Howie at Fur-Bearers Canada, Lesley Fox at Fur-Bearers B.C., Bryce Casavant a former CO Officer who in 2015 earned international attention when he respectfully declined an order to destroy two bear cubs, and Ellie Lamb at North Shore Black Bear Society for all of your support and advice. Also a special shout out and thank you to Fur-Bearers B.C.'s experienced wildlife volunteer, Marcia

Potter, who transported the young bear to Critter Care Wildlife Society, an authorized rehabilitation facility, and helped give this little cub (now known as Bear #10) a second chance at life.

Many individuals offered financial support during the past week, and although greatly appreciated, we have declined all offers. Instead we would ask you to consider making a donation to one of the following organizations that work to protect B.C. bears and their habitat.

We are forever grateful for all of the help that everyone gave us. THANK YOU SO MUCH!!! We also want to thank all of the wonderful people on social media that supported us and wrote letters to the government advocating for B.C. wildlife. Thank you all so much!!

Finally we would encourage everyone, especially those of us living in bear territory, to be "Bear Aware". Have a better understanding of bear behaviour, learn how to minimize human/bear interactions/conflicts, and do our part to keep bears wild. It is of vital importance for all of us to learn of the issues affecting BC bears and the necessity to preserve BC bear habitat.
