



## An Update From Jamie

It's been a busy few months as your new Council has settled into its work. To ensure we are focused, productive, and working on what matters most to you, we conducted two public sessions devoted to strategic planning. Our goal being, to agree upon a set of priorities for the remainder of the term, that would form the work plan for Council and staff in pursuit of our community goals. We appreciated the community's collaboration and input. The result of these sessions is a Strategic Planning Priority List adopted by Council.

Strategic Planning Priority List:

- 1. Asset Management Financial Plan / Sustainability
  - a. Roads Asset Management
  - b. Midden Road Discussion
  - c. Draínage Plan
  - d. Depreciation Management
- 2. Consolidated Enhanced Fire Protection

a. Emergency Preparedness and FíreSmart

b. Monitored Fire Alarms

c. Water Hook up for Sprinkler (waive water connection fee \$750)

d. Water Capacity for firefighting (Reservoir)

e. Tree Bylaw and Report

f. Application to the Province to request a local variance (Sprinklers)

- 3. Parking Bylaw Enforcement Public information meeting
- 4. Official Community Plan Review and update
- 5. Group Wharfage and Lifting of the Moratorium on Marine Ave and Senkler Road

In addition to developing the Strategic Planning priorities, Council, with our staff, financial consultant and auditors (Ken Bjorgaard and KPMG LLP), has completed an audit of the Village of Belcarra 2020 Financial Statements.

Key highlights of the Village 2020 financial position and results are as follows:

• The Village annual surplus, on an accrual basis, was \$405,392 for 2020 (includes amortization expense for tangible capital assets and other accruals).

- At the end of 2020, the unrestricted accumulated cash surplus in all operating funds (general, water, and waste and recycle) totalled \$348,870 (an increase in \$9,108 over 2019);
- Reserve fund balances increased by \$337,627 in 2020 to \$1,502,344; and
- Long-term debt decreased by \$141,713 from \$3,590,915 to \$3,449,202.

We also worked with our financial consultant to develop a 5-Year Financial Plan for 2021 to 2025. Council has approved the following increases:

- 7% per increase in property taxes in 2021 and each year thereafter in the plan to 2025
- 12% per increase in water user rates in 2021 and each year thereafter in the plan to 2025
- 12% per increase WARD user rates in 2021 and each year thereafter in the plan to 2025.

At the April 26, 2021 Council meeting, Council received the recommendations of the Farrer Cove Committee, the recommendations of the Revenue Generation Committee and the recommendations of the Tree Committee. The work of these committees is now considered concluded. Council is grateful to the members of these committees for their considerable contribution to our Village and the many hours of volunteer time they devoted to this work. The recommendations they have provided to Council will be reviewed and considered in the months ahead. Council passed the following recommendations pertaining to the Water Committee:

That the appointment of members to the Water Committee be extended to July 31, 2021; and

That the committee be consulted prior to the date to discuss their recommendations to Council for the future role of the committee.

#### Happy birthday, Queen Victoria!

At that time, it was celebrated with picnics, parades, sporting tournaments, fireworks and cannon salutes.

When Queen Victoria died in 1901, Canada's parliament officially named the holiday Victoria Day.

It was decided that the day would be celebrated on the second last Monday in May. In 2021, that's May 24th.




## Belcarra Blockwatch

The warm spring weather is signalling the beginning of boating season. Many residents of Belcarra will soon be towing their boats along busy roads to boat launch sites. Here are some safety tips from the RCMP for pulling a boat or trailer:

- Ensure that the tires on the trailer and tow vehicle are properly inflated.
- Connect safety chains properly.
- Make sure that your boat is properly secured to the trailer.
- Check that the trailer's signal lights and brake lights are operating properly.
- Ensure that the trailer is properly secured to the trailer hitch.
- Secure and contain all equipment and cargo. This will keep it from shifting within the boat which can affect stability or falling out into traffic.
- Allow for more space between yourself and the vehicle ahead of you. The added weight will increase the stopping distance required.
- If you are traveling for an extended period stop in a safe location to make sure brake lights and signal lights are still working properly.
- Exercise caution when passing another vehicle. The added weight of the boat can dramatically reduce acceleration.



Bedwell Bay Land To Be Sold Researched By: Ralph Drew, Belcarra, BC, Apríl 2021. Source: Vancouver Daíly World, Tuesday, August 17th, 1909,


Dominion Government Reserve opposite to Barnet on North Arm is now being surveyed in small sections ready for auction which will be held this fall — Nice Location.

It is reported in circles in close touch with the Dominion Government that a large section of the reserve, part of the Railway Belt, in the vicinity of Bedwell Bay, will be placed on the market in small holdings early this fall. [In actual fact, the auction did not take place until April 6th, 1911.] The district includes some of the finest land in the vicinity of the city [Vancouver] according to local men who have vainly trying to register homesteads there for the last four or five years. There is a gradual slope back from the North Arm [Indian Arm] to Deer Lake [Sasamat Lake] and behind the latter body of water also there is considerable desirable land which will appeal to the man that is after a small ranch or summer home.

Bedwell Bay has long been one of Vancouver's favourite camping spots. There are many bungalows along the shore [mostly squatters' shacks] at the present time, but the majority of these are not on government land. At first it was the intention of the Dominion Government to sell a large block of the land by tender. A surveyor was sent out from Ottawa to report on the district and it was because of his recommendation that the land would be a boon to the investor of moderate means, who wished to establish a summer house for himself and family, that Dominion surveyor J. B. Johnson and staff were sent out to split up the district. These men are now at work on the completion of the survey and an announcement of the date of the sale may be expected.

Some time ago the Dominion Government decided that the city [Vancouver] could not build a Pest House [infectious disease isolation hospital] on that section of reserve [Admiralty Point Military Reserve] granted to the corporation for the site of a public institution [the city jail]. It is evident at the present time that Ottawa had visions of the auction sale when it flatly refused the city permission to build on one of the beauty spots of the North Arm.

## HMCS Regina FFH-334 is one of the twelve Halifax-class fighting frigates currently serving the Royal Canadian Navy.

The modern Royal Canadian Navy (RCN) currently fields a collection of twelve fighting frigates belonging to the Halifax-class. Among their number is HMCS Regina (FFH-334), built to the standard by MIL Davie Shipbuilding of Lauzon beginning October 1989 and commissioned for service on December 29th, 1993. She maintains an active presence in the fleet and is assigned to operations in the Pacific Theater.

The class is built on the concept of a guided-missile frigate with its primary armament suite being comprised largely of missile weapons. The group has origins in the latter Cold War-period and were ordered by the Canadian government in December 1977 as a six-strong



class to begin with - with the initial intention being a complete collection of twenty such warships. Mounting costs and program delays ultimately forced the program to be scaled back and the first contracts were not handed down until June 1983. This resulting in the class being built in two batches of six vessels (thus twelve total warships realized before the end).

HMCS Regina (FFH-334) became the fifth ship of the class and is named after Regina, Saskatchewan. She saw refitting (the "FELEX" - "Frigate Equipment Life EXtension" - refit program) during May 2015 until April 2016 to extend her operational service life. Upgrades were made to her helicopter facilities as well as communications, Command and Control (C2), and Electronic Warfare (EW) departments/components.

Due to her Cold War era origins, Regina lacks the smooth lines of modern, stealth-centric guided-missile frigates. Instead, the design showcases various protrusions and outcroppings, complete with an exposed main mast at the bridge superstructure and relatively tall smoke funnel at midships. Over the forecastle is the typical turreted deck gun surrounded by railing that runs along most of the forward hull line. The bridge section is seated low in the design and integrated to the structure is the main mast and radar array. The smoke funnel at midships is followed by the aft-superstructure which includes several more radars and support systems as well as defensive solutions. Over the stern is a single-helicopter helipad supporting the Síkorsky CH-148 "Cyclone" helicopter.

## CHEWY FUDGY HOMEMADE BROWNIES - YIELD: 16-20

#### BROWNIES

Submitted by Carol Drew

Prep Time: 25 minutes - Total Time: 1 hour, 10 minutes plus cooling

Ingredients

•1/2 cup (115g) salted butter

•8 ounces (228g) coarsely chopped quality semi-sweet chocolate

•3/4 cup (150g) granulated sugar

•1/4 cup (50g) packed light brown sugar

•3 large eggs

•l teaspoon vanilla extract

•1/2 cup + 2 Tablespoons (80g) allpurpose flour (measure this accurately)

•2 Tablespoons (11g) unsweetened cocoa powder

•1/4 teaspoon sea salt

•1 cup (180g) semi-sweet chocolate chips

#### Directions:

1.Melt the butter and chopped chocolate in a medium saucepan on medium heat, stirring constantly, about 5 minutes. Or melt in a medium microwave safe bowl in 20 second increments, stirring after each, in the microwave. Remove from the heat, pour into a large mixing bowl, and allow to slightly cool for 10 minutes. 2.Adjust the oven rack to the lower third position and preheat oven to 350F degrees. Line the bottom and sides of a 9x9 inch square baking pan with aluminum foil or parchment, leaving an overhang on all sides. Set aside.

3.Whisk the granulated and brown sugars into the cooled chocolate/butter mixture. Add the eggs, one at a time, whisking until smooth after each addition. Whisk in the vanilla. Gently fold in the flour, cocoa powder, and salt. Once combined, fold in the chocolate chips.

4.Pour batter into the prepared baking pan and bake for 35-36 minutes or until the brownies begin to pull away from the edges of the pan. A toothpick inserted in the center should come out with only a few moist crumbs when the brownies are done. All ovens are different, so keep an eye on them after 30 minutes and use the toothpick test to see when yours are finished.

5.Allow the brownies to cool completely in the pan set on a wire rack. Once cooled, lift the foil out of the pan using the overhang on the sides and cut into squares. For neat squares, I use a very sharp knife and wipe it clean with a paper towel after each cut.

### Storage

Freeze up to 2-3 months - thaw overnight in the refrigerator before serving.
