



WILSON, Thomas Desmond (Des)

A beautiful Irish light went out suddenly when Des Wilson died of an apparent heart attack early Sunday morning on April 18th, 2021.

Thomas Desmond Wilson was born, shortly after his twin brother Alan, in Belfast, Northern Ireland on June 20th, 1946, sons of Tom and Allison Wilson.

Des went on to graduate with a BSc (Honours) in Geology from Queen's University in Belfast in 1969 and then immigrated to

Canada. He came to Hendrix Lake, BC to work for Noranda Mines as the Resident Mine Geologist. In 1971, Des moved to New Westminster to teach Geology at Douglas College where he taught for 25 years before becoming Chair of the Science and Mathematics Department in 1995. He was a dedicated educator.

Before becoming Chair, Des served as president of the Faculty Association (DCFA) and was instrumental in a transformative change to the hiring process which created a much fairer and more efficient path to job stability through regularization.

In 1996 Des became Dean of the Faculty of Science and Technology at Douglas College and he won several program innovation awards in recognition of leadership in program development. He was a fair, warm, caring and effective leader.

Des loved woodworking, built a cedar strip canoe he loved paddling, and joined the Greater Vancouver Woodturners Guild when we moved to Belcarra. He thoroughly enjoyed all the many activities made possible through the GVWG. As with every group Des joined, he was an active member. And he made many beautiful pieces of wood art.

Des was always a committed supporter of the arts, and he cared deeply about social justice and his community. He was a compassionate and caring father. Des was a wonderfully kind warm man who made every occasion more fun with his infectious Irish humour. His life journey was a masterpiece and he did make a difference. He was a delight with whom to share a life.

Left to mourn are his wife Adrienne, his daughter Hilary, his brother Alan and wife Maureen, his uncle Alan and aunt Mary, his brother-in-law Jeffrey and wife Kenda, his brother-in-law Stuart and wife Catherine, his cousins, his many nieces and nephews, and his many, many friends.


A celebration of Des's life will be held at a later date. Sympathy may be expressed through a donation to a charity of your choice.

Stories From The Archives

— Belcarra Land Sale — Noted Gold Quest is Recalled in Suit Before Court

Researched By: Ralph Drew, Belcarra, BC, May 2021. Source: Vancouver Daily Province, Saturday, September 11th,

"Echoes of a noted quest for gold are heard in Supreme Court [in September 1925] where Charles Albert Crook, Powell River baker, is suing Harry Musclow and John James George, his wife Margaret, and their sons James and Albert, who reside at Belcarra on the North Arm [Indian Arm] of Burrard Inlet."

"Musclow some years ago had a considerable following who believed he could, through astrology, discover gold fields of fabulous value. He was convicted of conspiracy [in 1917 for fraud] and was sentenced to five years [in the B.C. Penitentiary]. Since his release from prison, Musclow has reported to have left for the United States, Eastern Canada and England."

"Thirty disciples of Musclow gathered at Belcarra preparatory to setting-out for the promised 'El Dorado.' They were converts to Musclow's 'Aquarian Movement', and like 'fish', they swallowed his tales and demonstrated their faith by purchasing mining equipment and handing over their wealth to him."

"Gold nuggets the size of walnuts would be found, according to the leader; but the astronomical bodies must first be propitious and take-up a certain position in the heavens."

"Mr. Crook owned land at Belcarra which he sold to Musclow for \$3350 [in 1919]. Two dollars was paid and the balance was to be turned over in installments of \$1116 on November 22nd, 1920, 1921 and 1922 with interest at the rate of 14 per cent."

"Plaintiff alleges he received no further payments and he seeks cancellation of the agreement and recovery of possession of the land from the George family, whom he alleges is in occupation."

"Defendants plead that Crook and they were members of the community founded by Musclow, and that he was trustee of the property for them all. They ask for an accounting and allege that the moneys were paid on the purchase agreement. They aver [state] that improvements, such as gardens, stone walls and jetties have been made by them to the place and that Crook has been thus compensated by these community services."

After Notes:

- 1. In 1910, Harry Musclow's name first appeared in Vancouver newspapers when he advertised his services as a real estate broker.
- In 1917, numerous newspaper articles appeared in the Vancouver press regarding Harry Musclow, law suites and charges of conspiracy to commit fraud stemming from financial dealings with the followers of his 'Aquarian Movement'.
- In 1919, Harry Musclow was released from prison early for good behaviour, and one newspaper article stated that a number of his followers lived "near Belcarra".







If I wrote a letter to council and it was just received as correspondence then it would not be considered as an agenda item and; therefore, I would not be able to discuss the letter content during the public question period at the end of the meeting. Then in order to discuss my item of interest it would be necessary to APPLY to be received as a delegation at the next council meeting in order to ask my question as an agenda item if allowed.

THIS IS NOT FAIR

We are a small Village and we do not need to follow the practice of some other, larger municipalities. Just because some large municipalities do this doesn't mean that we must...IT IS OUR CHOICE. In the past our Village officials have allowed pretty open discussion. WHY close off Villagers' participation in our small Village? Do the Mayor and Council really believe that the gallery will continue to attend council meetings, try to participate, and stay involved if we are to be shut down and out?

Mayor and Council PLEASE reconsider your decision. It is NOT a rule ... it IS an OPTION that you hold the authority to re-open the public question period to any subject. DO NOT punish ALL Villagers because there may be some who would abuse this opportunity to speak out.

KAHLUA PECAN PIE

(super easy to make!) Submitted by Bonni Marshall

Ingredients:

- -1/4 cup butter
- -3/4 granulated sugar
- -1 tsp. vanilla
- -2 Tbsp. flour
- 3 eggs
- 1/2 cup Kahlua (optional: use a little less Kahlua & add a little Hazelnut Liqueur 'Frangelico')
- -1/2 cup dark corn syrup
- -3/4 cup evaporated milk
- -1 cup whole or chopped pecans

Optional: 1/2 cup of semi-sweet chocolate (or choc. chips)

Optional: whipped cream or ice-cream

Directions:

- Preheat oven to 400 degrees F.
- Line a 9 in. pie pan with your favourite pastry. Chill. (Note: A store bought pie crust can be used, but the filling makes more than what will fit into a store bought shell). The good news is that you can put the extra filling in store bought tart shells:))
- Cream together butter, sugar, vanilla and flour. Mix well.
- Beat in eggs, one at a time.
- Stir in Kahlua (and Frangelico if using), corn syrup, evaporated milk and pecans (and choc. chips if using).
- Mix well, pour into pie shell
- Bake for 10 minutes, then reduce heat to 325 degrees F. and bake until firm (about 40 minutes). Chill.
- Serve with whipped cream or ice cream, if desired.
 - Note: This pie is rich, so small slices work well. That means the pie will easily feed 8 to 10 people.


