On April 25th, Belcarra Council declined to support a motion that would have provided funding for an engineering study along Bedwell Bay Road. This study would have given the Village engineering findings for future decisions on drainage, culvert replacement and a multiuse path (MUP). The often misunderstood circumstances surrounding this motion were passionately debated. There were many Villagers that attended, some spoke eagerly, sincerely and eloquently. In the end, the motion was narrowly defeated by three votes to two. I urge that interested Villagers view the full debate on the Village website.


Belcarra's financial audit was received on April 25 and provided no surprises. The Village remains in good shape financially.

VILLAGE OF BELCARRA 2022 ANNUAL CHIPPING MAY 2 & 3, 2022





<u>IMPORTANT NOTICE</u>: The chipping program shall only take place once per year.

Please utilize the organics bins for smaller amounts of chipping. Take your larger amounts to the United Boulevard Recycling and Waste Centre at 995 United Boulevard.

Residents are encouraged to dispose of their green waste material in the Organics bin at the Village Waste and Recycle Depot. <u>Tuesday</u> is a good day for adding larger amounts as the bin is hauled and emptied on Wednesdays.

Please note there is a change in procedure:

- Each residence is allowed one free chipping pile which does not require a tag.
- Due to the COVID 19 pandemic situation, additional tags will not be sold this year.
- Each road will be serviced only <u>once</u>. Staff will not return to areas already chipped.

Important Details:

- Chipping material must be out before **7:30** am on the above date to ensure that it will be picked up.
- Pile size must not exceed 1.0M x 1.0M x 3.0M (3' x 3' x 10')
- Clean, uncontaminated branches **up to 0.1 metres (4 inches) in diameter** to be stacked at the front of the property from which the material originated, with the larger ends aligned in the direction of travel. (This allows Workers to chip the branches with minimum exposure to traffic.)

Piles will NOT BE CHIPPED that:

- o do not conform to specifications and requirements
- o are considered contaminated containing: stumps, root-balls, grass, ivy, leaves (bagged or piled), blackberry vines, vegetation with thistles, thorns or irritants, or soil, rocks, wire, metal and nails.
- Unsuitable piles will be tagged and will be left for appropriate removal by the Resident or Owner and must be removed within 7 days of the chipping date above.

Please note:

- Larger volumes of vegetation for removal should be contracted to a tree service company.
- Keep the roadway clear for the passage of traffic.
- Success of the program depends on Resident cooperation follow instructions carefully and contact Village Hall at 604 937-4100 if you have any questions.



Belcarra Blockwatch

A big 'thank you' to Barbara Shelly for her candid letter in the April issue of the Belcarra Barnacle, reminding us all about the 'grandparent phone (or text) scam.' This is a particularly insidious crime that preys on many caring, kind seniors.

Scam artists will use a grandparent's love and concern to separate an unsuspecting grandparent from their money.

Police in both Canada and the USA have reported a sudden uptick in seniors getting frantic telephone calls or texts - even knocks on doors - alerting them that a grandchild has been in a serious car accident or has been arrested. Sometimes the call will be from the 'grandchild' him/herself, the voice disguised by so-called 'injuries'.

The caller will then demand money to help pay bail or legal fees. There is always urgency and secrecy involved: "Please don't let my Mom and Dad know."

Many gangs have turned to the grandparents scam as a source of quick, easy cash. And it *is* extremely lucrative. In one eleven month period in 2021, seventy American seniors were defrauded of 2 million dollars through a country- wide operation. A national ring of fraudsters, making use of well-rehearsed scripts and information gleaned from the grandchild's social media, were involved.

Criminals are also aware that this type of theft is very hard to track and perpetrators suffer less severe or stringent penalties and sentences than with other more violent crimes. There are now literal "boiler rooms and call centres" in India, China and Russia operating around this scheme.

The RCMP offer the following tips to help protect residents in the area:

- Be suspicious of any such emergency calls, especially if they occur late at night.
- Never withdraw and send money to anyone you do not know.
- Never give out personal information on the phone or online to someone you do not know. The police or the courts will not ask for personal information over the phone.
- If the person is saying a family member is in trouble, confirm with that family member or other family members prior to taking action.
- If the caller claims to be a grandchild and you are in doubt, ask questions that only he/she would know the answer to.
- If you have a gut feeling that something is not right, trust it. Hang up and call your local RCMP.

Stories From The Archives

Mighty Harbour Plan Proposed For Indian Arm

Researched By: Ralph Drew, Belcarra, BC, February 2022. Source: Vancouver Province, Thursday, September 23rd, 1*958*, page 14.

"Gottfrid Dahlstrom is probably many years ahead of the actual need, but his proposal for the Indian Arm of Vancouver Harbour is so unique and ambitious that it merits airing."

"A consulting engineer who came here from Vastervik, Sweden, about five years ago [1953], Dahlstrom looked over the growing metropolis area and his eyes lit on the east shore of Indian Arm, just outside the mouth of Bedwell Bay, across the water from Deep Cove [the west side of the Belcarra Peninsula]. There he feels is a geographic situation ripe for development."

"Mr. Dahlstrom thinks big, as the following outline will demonstrate: 'We propose that B.C. Electric [today, B.C. Hydro] move its now-building thermal power plant [Burrard Thermal Plant] from loco to the Indian Arm site where it could be buried in the rock bluff shore, much as Alcan's Kemano power house is built inside a mountain.' Utilizing Swedish techniques, he says, would material increase the efficiency of the plant."

"The excavated rock fill, dumped along the shoreline, would create 6,800 feet [2,073 m] of quay for deep sea shipping piers. Grain elevators could be erected at the site."

"In the area, estimated Dahlstrom, there are over 500 acres [over 200 ha = almost all of Belcarra] of land suitable for light and heavy industry plants."

"The CPR, he continues, could build a three-mile [4.8 km] spur line from loco, providing a rail link. An oil line could be run from Imperial's refinery. A natural gas pipeline could also be run into the site with comparative ease."

"Continuing, Mr. Dahlstrom envisions a road rimming the [Belcarra] peninsula to reach the site, and possibly a tunnel under the Indian Arm, at its narrow point, to provide a link with Cove Cliff and North Vancouver. Water for boilers could be pumped-in from adjacent Buntzen Lake."

"The Indian Arm is deep enough for heavy vessels, he says, and navigation charts would certainly seem to bear him out."

"'It's a most perfect location for industrial development', says the Swedish engineer."

"In total it's an admirable conception by a veteran engineer who has nothing more in mind than the betterment of his new home city. The local interests with whom Mr. Dahlstrom has discussed the scheme generally recognize it has merit."

"Unfortunately, however, their consensus appears to be — 'premature'. (The metropolitan area has plenty of waterfront for its deep-sea needs for some years to come.)"

"Premature, unless B.C. Electric (BCE) were captivated by that increased efficiency factor which Dahlstrom suggests is available. If the power company moved, there is little doubt that other facets of the imaginative scheme would promptly fall into place."

"But that's one for the BCE engineers."







Neat Facts about BEES From the Ontario Beekeepers Association

Did you know that...

- There are only three kinds of bees in a hive: Queen, Worker and Drone.
- The queen bee lays the eggs. She will lay around 1,500 eggs per day.
- The worker bees are all female. They do all
 of the work for the hive. They clean, feed
 baby bees, feed and care for the queen,
 pack pollen and nectar into the comb, build
 and repair the honeycombs, and they cool
 and guard the hive.
- Outside the hive, the worker bees gather the nectar and pollen.
- Bees have two stomachs one for eating and the other special stomach to store and carry nectar and water back to their hive.
- Males bees are called drones. Their job is to mate with the queen. Male drone bees do not have stingers.
- The worker bees have stingers. If a worker bee uses her stinger, she will die.
- Bees are classified as insects.
- Bees have five eyes and six legs.
- Bees go through four stages of development: Egg, Larvae, Pupae and Adult Bee.
- Bees use their honeycomb cells to raise their babies in, and to store nectar, honey, pollen and water.

- Nectar is a sweet watery substance that the bees gather. After they process the nectar in their special stomach, they regurgitate it into the honeycomb cells in their hive. Next they fan with their wings to remove excess moisture. The final result is HONEY!
- Bees are the only insect in the world that make food that humans can eat.
- A beehive in summer can have as many as 50,000 to 80,000 bees. A bee must collect nectar from about 2 million flowers to make 1 pound of honey. It requires 556 worker bees to gather a pound of honey. Bees fly more than once around the world to gather a pound of honey.
- The average worker bee makes about 1/12th of a teaspoon of honey in her lifetime.



It's hard to say what a bee's favourite day is, but 20 May is the birth date of Anton Janša (1734–1773), a Slovenian beekeeper, one of the pioneers of modern beekeeping.


