



Mayor's Report

Belcarra Council met on September 6. Please refer to the Village website for more detail.

Highlights:

- Sasamat Lake outlet dam effecting Windermere Creek. Follow up to be provided.
- Invasive plant species' distribution in Belcarra.
 Control work planned for this October.
- West Road name change.
- Belcarra Online GIS map to include lot sizes.
- Water system model analysis and forward planning options.
- Translink major road network funding update.
- Emergency Mass Notification procedure/app
- Reopening of Village Hall for public use.

Council, chaired by Councillor John Snell, was given an update of the work of the Official Community Plan (OCP) Review Committee and received further recommendations. These were accepted by Council.*

Belcarra Blockwatch

Here are some tips from Block Watch for a safe Halloween:

- Do not use masks. Masks make it hard for children to see what's around them, including cars. Make-up is a better choice.
- Make or buy costumes in light-coloured material.
- Place strips of reflective tape on the back and front of costumes, so that drivers can better see your child.
- Costumes should fit properly to prevent trips and falls. Avoid items such as oversized shoes, high heels, long dresses and long capes.
- Dress your child for the weather.
- Children under 10 should be accompanied by an adult for trick or treating.
- Keep in mind that gum and hard candy can pose a choking hazard.

If your child is going out without an adult:

- Make sure your child is in a group of at least 3 people.
- Give them a flashlight. A cell phone is also a good idea.
- Discuss in advance the route they should follow. Ask them to call you if they plan to go off the discussed route.
- Set a curfew (and make sure they have a watch or phone with them).
- Tell your children not to eat anything until they get home.
- Carry a white bag to carry the candy to increase visibility.

- Don't visit houses that are not well lit. Never go inside a stranger's house.
- Use the sidewalk whenever possible. If there's no sidewalk, walk on the side of the road facing traffic.
- Don't criss-cross back and forth across the street. Work your way up one side of the street, and then start on the other side
- Once home, ask your parents to look through your treats with you to make sure everything is okay.

For homeowners:

- Turn on outdoor lights, and replace burnt-out bulbs.
- Remove items from your yard or porch that might trip a child.
- Sweep wet leaves from your steps and driveway.
- Use alternative to candles in your pumpkins, such as a flashlight or a battery-operated candle.
- Some children have food allergies. Consider offering alternative treats such as stickers or a small toy.

Alternative spots to trick-or-treat:

- Local community centres sometimes offer Halloween night activities.
- Local shopping centres often have trick-or-treat nights for young children in a more controlled environment.
- Plan a Halloween night at home with themed games and movies. Invite friends to join in.

Stories From The Archives

Start New Logging Camp

Source: Vancouver Province, Monday, May 8th, 1905, page 12. Researched By: Ralph Drew, Belcarra, B.C., September 2022.

'Ironside, Rainie & Campbell' Will Cut Timber on North Arm

"A new logging camp is to be started shortly on the North Arm [Indian Arm] of Burrard Inlet that will give employment to a large number of men."

"Although the well-known contracting firm of 'Ironside, Rainie & Campbell' has just finished one of the largest contracts undertaken in the Province since the early days of the C.P.R. construction, that of the power tunnel between Lakes Beautiful [Lake Buntzen] and Coquitlam, the shores of the North Arm of the Inlet will continue to be the scene of activity with the firm for some years to come. The firm owns a large area of valuable timber growing on the slopes and mountainsides along the west shore of the North Arm. According to the statement of Mr. William Rainie, it is the intention to establish a camp there shortly and get the timber out." "While nearly all the timber is sitting many feet above sea level, it will be comparatively easy to get it to tide water for transportation to the mills. To accomplish this, a number of log chutes will be constructed running from the waters of the inlet to a considerable height up the mountains. The timber, while not of very large growth, consists of mainly cedar and fir, and would command good prices."

"In the logging operations, a portion of the firm's plant which was used in the drilling of the power tunnel, and is now at the Lake Coquitlam and Lake Beautiful [Lake Buntzen] portals of the tunnel, will be employed. The plant at the Coquitlam portal of the tunnel will be brought through the tunnel in a few days, before the water is turned-on, and trans-shipped to the site selected for the establishing of a logging camp [most likely location being Buntzen Bay]."







Flower Arranging 101 by Megan Davis

How lucky to have Carol's daughter, Megan, demonstrate flower arranging for our little club. Wow... she is an incredible flower artist, an amazing environmentally conscious small business owner, and a delightful teacher too!





Megan demonstrated flower arranging using one of her favourite types of vases, the pedestal bowl. We learned that the florist terminology for the ugly underpinnings is called the "mechanics"! Megan suggested using a flower frog which has some weight to it, to counter balance the flowers. No matter what you use, make sure that your mechanics are hidden. That includes the hard rim of the vase itself.

When starting your arrangement, know your viewing level. Is it a dining room table with 360 degrees viewing or a side buffet with only one side? It will be more comfortable (for you!) to use a high countertop and a lazy Susan when constructing your artistic creation!

Choosing your flowers can be simple or complex... do you have a specific plan or are you using a variety of flowers from your garden? Don't be afraid to mix in some purchased blooms as well! Colour choices range from one featured hue to a riot of colours. Ombre arrangements are planned with light to dark shades or vice versa.

Cut off the bottom leaves of your chosen flowers. For woody stemmed flowers such as hydrangeas, do a cross cut on the bottom and dip it in Alum. If you see wilting in your arrangement, recut the stem and dip it in hot (not boiling) water. You will see bubbles come out. Here's an interesting tip: Megan uses a turkey baster for watering her delicate arrangements!

Don't be afraid to use older flowers as a base in between or below your newer ones. Megan effectively used a sunflower whose petals had fallen off! Dahlias and zinnias are particular good choices as cutting the flowers encourages more blooms. Long flowers, such as gladiolas, can be used full-size or can be cut in half with the top, unopened flower stem adding an interesting feature. Grasses add softness to lighten the visual weight. Ornamental hops are attractive and airy. Vines add a touch of movement and whimsy.

Megan's love of flowers and gardens is intimately connected to her respect for the environment and nature. She admires the Jane Goodall perspective: You can't protect something you don't love and you can't love what you don't know. Megan's small business is active in "giving back" and she supports many important causes.




